<u>Harriet Tubman</u>

Considered to be the first African American Women to serve in the military, Harriet Tubman served as a scout, spy, guerrilla soldier, and nurse for the Union Army during the Civil War. Tubman dedicated her life to freeing those who were enslaved to the North where she later helped many of those individuals find food. shelter, and even jobs. By 1860. Tubman had traveled down South 19 times to free over 70 people including both her parents.



Amelia Earhart

After passing her flying test in
December of 1921 Amelia
Earhart went on to break a
multitude of records and being
known as one of the first
females in the profession.
Despite being told "no" by so
many in her life, Earhart went
on to set seven different speed
records. She also helped found
The Ninety-Nines, Inc., in
1929, the first organization for
women aviators which she
used to promote women
involvement in the aviation

field.

Office of Victim Services & Victim Service Application

C.A.S.A. of Dutchess County is now entering its second year with the Office of Victim Services (O.V.S.) portion of our program which allows us to file a compensation claim on behalf of our children that fit the criteria. The claim may cover help with medical bills and counseling expenses; burial and funeral costs; lost wages; and other types of assistance.


